

**Call for Applications:**

2022-2023 Edith O'Donnell Graduate Fellowships in Art History  
at the Edith O'Donnell Institute of Art History

The Edith O'Donnell Institute of Art History invites applications from PhD students at the University of Texas at Dallas for a limited number of 2022-2023 Edith O'Donnell Graduate Fellowships, which support outstanding dissertations in art history and related fields.

For the 2022-2023 academic year, each O'Donnell Fellow will be awarded a stipend, tuition waiver, and a private study carrel at the O'Donnell Institute. During the fellowship period, Fellows are expected to dedicate themselves to their dissertations full time and to participate in the scholarly life of the Institute. Fellows must submit two progress reports, one at the end of the fall semester and one at the end of the spring semester. During the year, Fellows will be invited to present their work in a formal seminar for Institute faculty and students.

To be eligible, applicants must have passed their field exams and received approval of the dissertation proposal by the end of the spring 2022 semester. Applications will be assessed on the basis of the project's scholarly merit and potential.

To apply, please prepare the following material in an application addressed to Dr. Michael Thomas, Director and Richard R. Brettell Distinguished University Chair, and Dr. Sarah Kozlowski, Associate Director, The Edith O'Donnell Institute of Art History:

1. A cover letter
2. A current curriculum vitae
3. A 250-word dissertation abstract
4. A 1,000-word overview of the dissertation project, describing the core material of study, animating questions, methodologies, and contributions to the field
5. A 500-word summary of work completed to date
6. A 500-word proposal for work to be completed during the fellowship year
7. The names, titles, and email addresses of all members of the dissertation committee
8. The names, titles, and email addresses of three faculty members and/or outside scholars who have agreed to write letters of recommendation on the applicant's behalf. One of the recommenders must be the chair of the dissertation committee. Recommenders must submit their letters separately by the due date below.
9. A letter from the applicant's graduate program administrator indicating how many credit hours of university support (scholarships, teaching assistantships, etc.) the applicant will have received by the beginning of the fall 2022 semester

Please submit these materials (except recommendation letters, which recommenders must submit separately) as a single pdf, using the applicant's last name as a file name, to Pierrette Lacour at [pierret@utdallas.edu](mailto:pierret@utdallas.edu) by March 1, 2022. All materials, including letters of recommendation, must be received by that date.
